The Ventnor City Fire Department hosts the fundraiser 10K in memory of Kenny Wayland, a 35 year old firefighter who died in the line of duty in 1972 responding to a fire at the 5000 Boardwalk beachfront apartment building.

The race started at the Ventnor library, which is located on Atlantic Avenue in the center of town. We arrived a few minutes ahead of the starting time, and we stretched and shared strategy about the course. All around were American flags, commemorating Memorial Day, which adds a feeling of patriotism and pride.

Promptly at 9 am, the runners are corralled via megaphone to meet at the starting line. Once there, the national anthem is sung, then a round of applause for the Wayland family, and finally, a short greeting by the mayor of Ventnor who shared words of gratitude. He then said, "1-2-3-Go" and we ran.

The course is flat and is very familiar. It was perfect running conditions, a cool 68 degrees and cloudy skies, with runners generally chatting it up for the entire run. (Continued on P. 2)
